Jodi Ito is the Information Security Officer (ISO) at the University of Hawai'i (UH) since 2000 and has been with the UH since 1982. She is responsible for the development and implementation of the University's new information security program, investigations and analyses cyber incidents and attacks, coordination any remediation and response efforts including coordination with any law enforcement agencies, awareness and training of information security issues and enforcing university policy with respect to the university's technology resources.

Currently, Jodi is president of the Honolulu Chapter of the Infragard Member Alliance and actively participates in the Honolulu Japanese Chamber of Commerce. She graduated from the University of Hawai'i at Mānoa with both a Bachelor of Science in Computer Science and a Master of Science in Information and Computer Science.

Benson Kwok is the Instructional Technology Coordinator for Glendale Unified School District. As part of the Educational Technology and Information Systems Department, he is currently leading the implementation of Office 365 and Microsoft Education tools in his district. He believes that offering Office 365 alongside Google Apps for Education will help meet the diverse needs of learners in preparing them for a dynamic and fast-changing world, while empowering educators with a variety of tools to enhance instruction. He works closely with the district professional development team and other departments to organize, facilitate and spearhead training across the district. In addition to Microsoft Edu and GAFE, he is focused on supporting the Open Educational Resources based math curriculum and Universal Design for Learning concepts in grades Kindergarten through 12.

One of Benson's presentations at the California Education Technology Professional Association in San Diego was "Blended Learning with Office 365" which focused on tools such as OneNote Class Notebooks, Skype, Sway and Office Mix. Benson reports he is happy to provide educators with views on how Microsoft tools can impact teaching and learning.
